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INTRODUCTION

Thoughtful Listening is designed to teach listening skills and to provide practice in remembering and thinking about facts. The teacher reads a short story. The students listen and then do an independent activity page which features memory exercises, vocabulary development, and thinking skills.

TEACHER DIRECTION

There are 30 different short stories in *Thoughtful Listening*. The stories start below and continue on the next seven pages. Activity pages for each story follow and are labeled to coincide with each story.

The teacher reads the story aloud. The story may be read twice to assist students in remembering details. The activity page is to be done independently. The activity page may be self-corrected and discussed in class to provide feedback and reinforcement.

STORY #1 — MAIL CARRIERS

People who carry mail to homes and businesses used to be called mailmen. Now they are called mail carriers because women, as well as men, carry the mail. They must sort letters and put them in order before leaving the post office. They sort them by ZIP codes. A ZIP code is a number code that stands for a particular part of your city or neighborhood. After the mail is sorted, mail carriers walk, ride bicycles, or drive their route to deliver the mail. They may also pick up letters from mailboxes along the way. They take this new mail to the post office when their deliveries are completed.

STORY #2 - HOW ANIMALS PROTECT THEMSELVES

Many animals have special body parts to protect themselves from their enemies. The porcupine has needlelike spines on its body. An attacking animal quickly runs away when it is pierced by these painful needles. The turtle protects itself by simply crawling into its hard shell. Several animals, like deer, have sharp hooves for fighting and can use the hooves to run away quickly. Birds can escape by flying. Tusks and a very thick skin protect the elephant. Do you know what desert animal shakes its tail to scare away its enemies?

STORY #3 - CHINESE RESTAURANT

Susan likes to go out to eat. One of her favorite places to eat is The Golden Dragon where she can order Chinese food. She likes to start her meal with steaming, hot soup. Next she is given a plate with three things on it. The plate has sweet-and-sour pork, chow mein, and fried rice. A platter is placed in the middle of the table. It is piled high with crispy shrimp. A small bowl of hot, spicy mustard is brought to the table. The mustard is good on the shrimp. After eating her meal, a small sweet dessert is brought to Susan. It is called a fortune cookie.
