

DIRECTING TRAFFIC



Every hour, hundreds of planes fly across the crowded skies. Someone has to watch where all these aircraft are going and make sure they don't fly into each other. The

people who do this job are called air traffic controllers.

Jeff is an air traffic controller at a big airport. His job is tough on the eyes because he must always watch a screen in front of him.

Every plane near the airport shows up as a dot on this screen.

Jeff talks with the pilots in many of these planes. He wears a radio headset, like a walkie-talkie. It allows him to hear the pilots and lets them hear him, too.

The pilots cannot take off without getting an O.K. from Jeff. First, he tells each pilot that it is all right to leave the gate. The gate is where the plane picks up its passengers. Then he tells the pilot which runway to use. Runways are roads on the ground for planes to use when they take off and land. Finally, Jeff gives each pilot the green light for take-off. Jeff also tells the pilots in the sky when it is safe to land and which runway they should use.

The safety of thousands of people in the air and on the ground depends on people like Jeff.

LAZY LIONS

Most lions do not live alone but belong to groups called prides. Some prides are small, with only four or five members. Others may have up to thirty lions. There might be one to three adult males, several lionesses, and cubs.

The pride usually stays together for years. However, by age three, the young males are driven from the pride by their fathers. They must then form prides of their own.

Lions often kill to live, and it is mostly the female lion who does the hunting. Since most animals can outrun a lion, she must depend on the element of surprise. The lion moves very slowly and quietly towards a grazing animal. At just the right time, it attacks.


Although they look powerful, lions are very lazy animals. They will spend up to twenty hours a day sleeping. Rather than doing their own hunting, lions will often seize the prey killed by another animal.



GARBAGE




