This unit is divided into 10 areas of study:

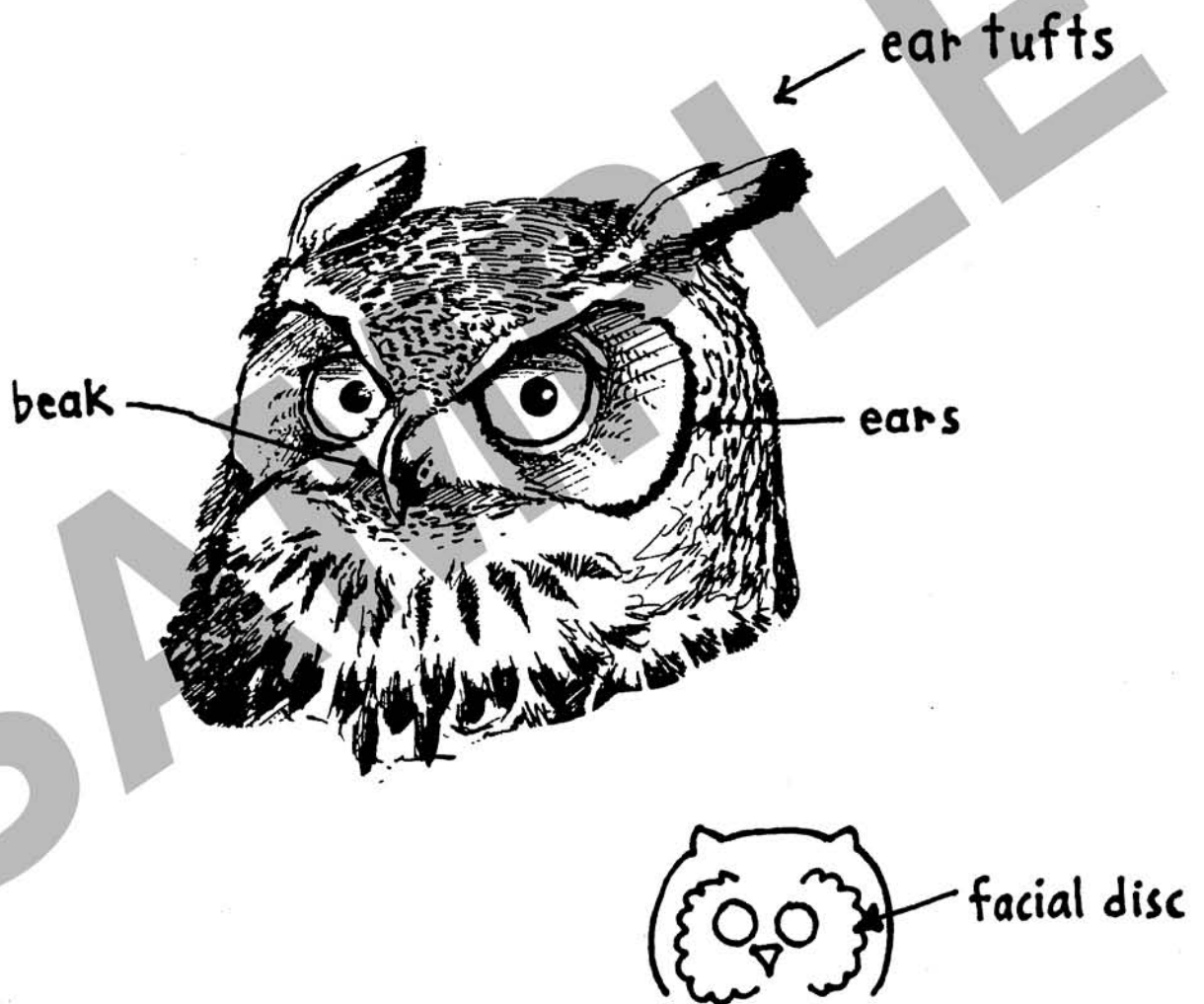

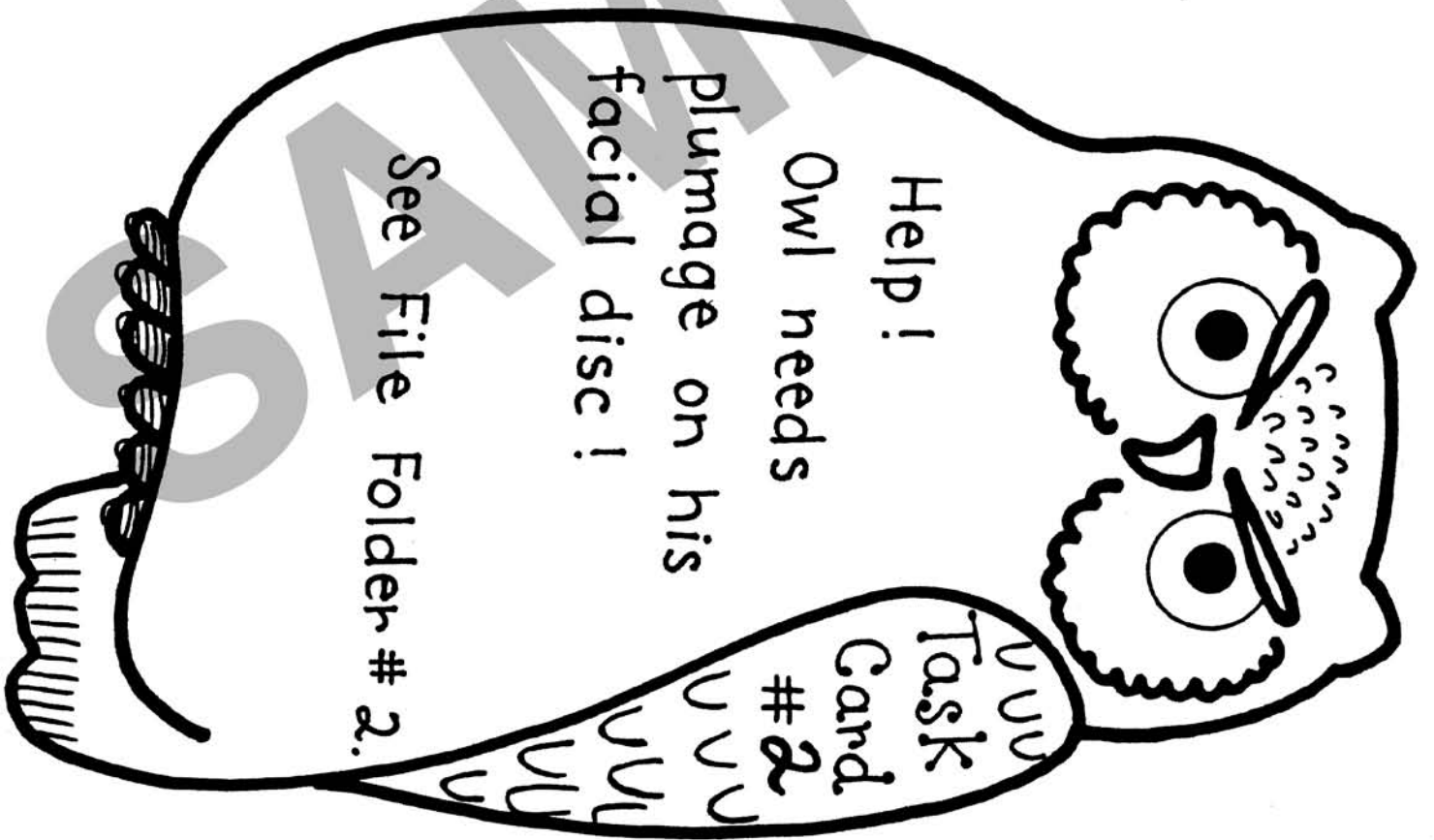
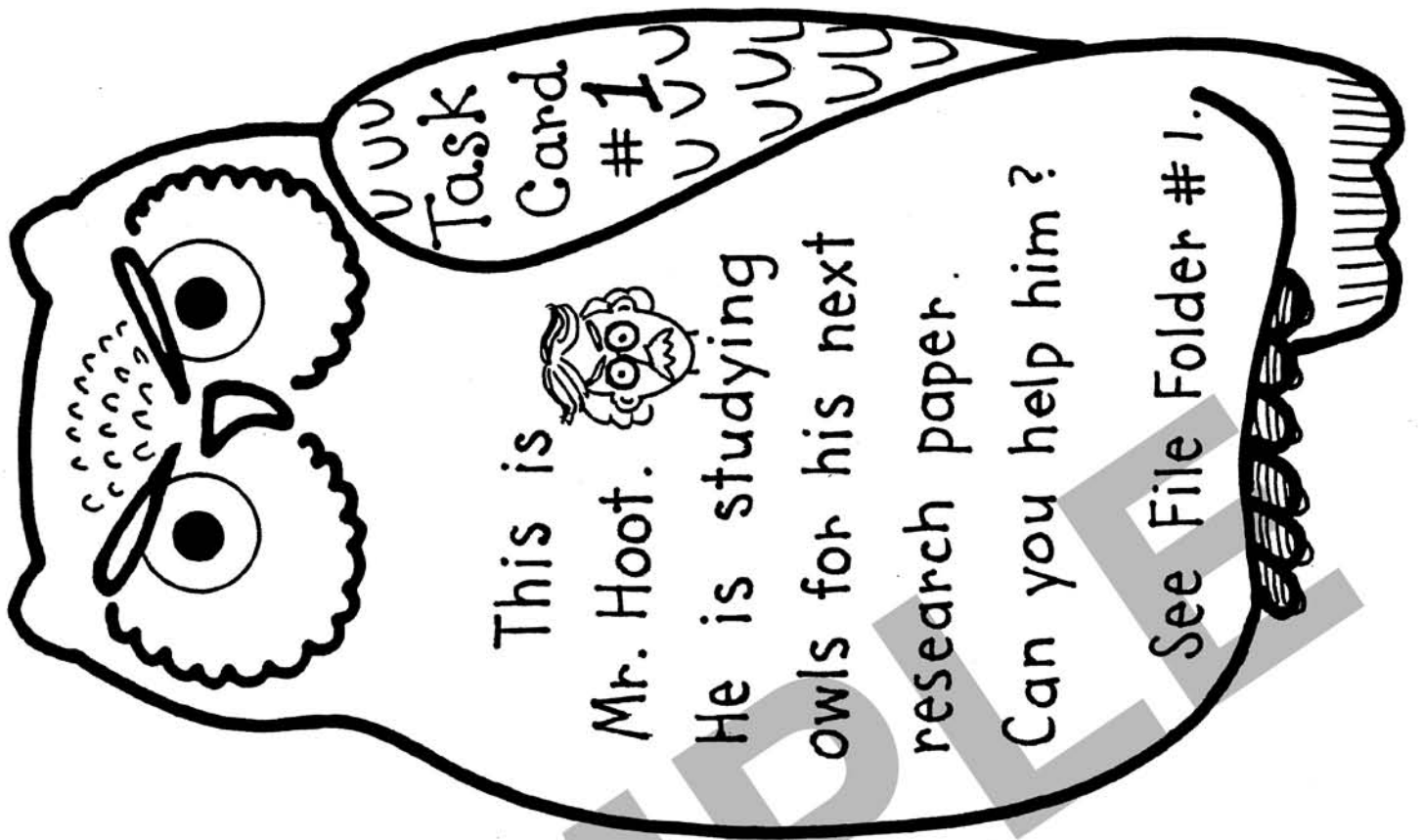
Resources included are:
