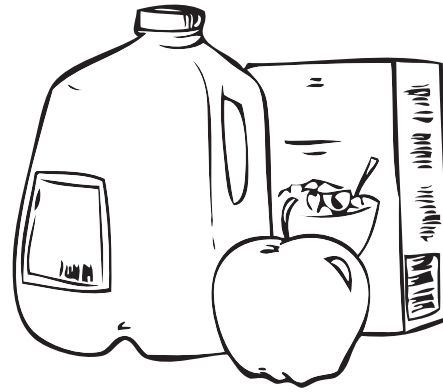

Students may find using a dictionary with some of the activities helpful.

Supermarket Words is written at a grade 3-4 reading level. It is designed for use in grades 4-12.

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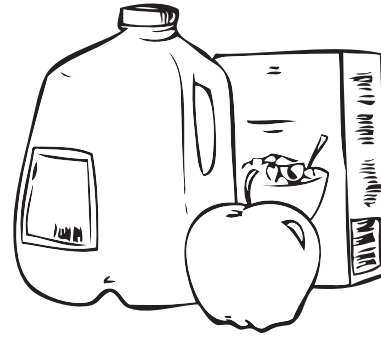

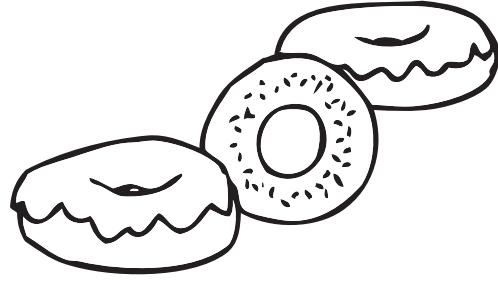

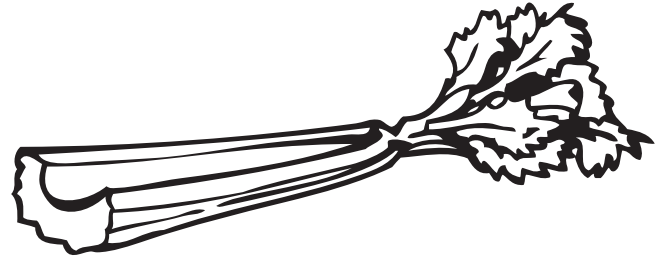
