

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INTRODUCTION

An important skill when writing stories, reports, and other kinds of compositions is knowing how to outline the content before the actual writing begins. Having the subject matter organized in a logical order according to main ideas, supporting ideas, and details provides a writing guide that will result in a well-thought-out and well-written paper. As students learn this helpful skill, they will recognize how it saves time, avoids revisions and rewrites, and makes the whole process of writing easier.

Outlining provides step-by-step formats that show how an outline is developed. It starts with choosing a title, goes on to sequencing main topics, and advances to the adding of subtopics and then details.

This book was designed for use in grades 3-4.

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WHAT IS AN OUTLINE?

An outline is a written plan that organizes ideas or facts in a logical order. We often use an outline to help us write a story or a report.

Title

The first part of an outline is the title. It tells what the outline is about. The title is written at the top of the page.


