Student objectives

- 1. Students will follow directions.
- 2. Students will make books for reading enjoyment.
- 3. Students will exercise creative skills.

How to set up

Photocopy the pages of the little book for each student. Staple on the left.


How to use

Encourage students to add more illustrations and to colour their books.

Use in a variety of ways

- 1. Students can read and complete as a class activity.
- 2. Students can take the books home to complete with a family member.
- 3. Students can complete with a care partner (older student).
- 4. Place a little book and the storyboard pictures for the story in a pocket folder. Send home for the family to enjoy.
- 5. Invite the family to participate in completing the little book with their child. This is a great project for National Family Literacy Day. Parent and child will bond through literacy and create a book to take home and share over and over.
